The following Wednesday of the 6th of January was less eventful but good sale from lunch time right through to the end of the day realized a profit of \$664.26. Our team for the day was John, Peter, Lorraine, Barry and Steven. Again it was hot!

My thanks to all the workers who volunteered to help and take some of the load off the regulars. If you have the time, it is a good project to volunteer for as it requires no planning on your part nor particular skills and you get a couple of hours on your service record. However, be warned that you will need to wash yourself and all your clothes unless you like smelling like a sausage sizzle and attracting the nosy attention of our canine citizens.

For all of our newer members I wish to confirm how important this fund raiser is to our club: It provides cash flow and adds up to about \$12,000 per year. Since we started this project the club has raised \$46,000. Now that's Sausage Power!
