I also was inspired by the story of Bobby Whitfield. It's not often that you hear a positive refugee story. But Bobby Whitfield is an exception to that rule.

Having fled Liberia as a teenager during the 1990 civil war, and spent eleven years raising his five younger siblings in a refugee camp, Bobby is the first Liberian refugee to graduate with a Masters degree from the University of Queensland, having qualified for a Masters of Development Practice.

As President of the Liberian Association of Queensland from 2004-2008, Bobby used his leadership skills and networking abilities to help fellow refugees through the implementation of community programs and projects. He has worked as the centre coordinator for the Annerley Literacy Centre and is presently the senior community development worker at the Multicultural Development Association, where his work involves community engagement, planning, capacity building and empowerment with more than 15 new and emerging communities.

Bobby said, "Australia has provided me the opportunity to transform from a child born behind a hut under the moon light with no birth certificate to becoming a well-educated, informed, knowledgeable and responsible man."

Another inspirational person is Paul Egan, now preparing for his 7th ride in the Tour de Cure, a marathon bike ride to raise funds for cancer prevention, research and patient support.

These are very impressive long distance high speed rides by highly trained and dedicated bike riders. On March 24, a team of 120 Riders, 35 Support Crew and with support from Channel 7 will ride from HOTHAM in the Snowy Mountains to HOBART, a distance of 1,270 km in nine days. Paul's goal is to raise \$12,000 before the ride and so far he is just over \$7,000. You can donate to Paul by going to <u>www.tourdecure.com.au</u> and searching on his name.

With a passion for strengthening primary-level health care networks, Catrina worked for a while in Kenya addressing the AIDS pandemic she spent considerable time working in the field of public health and community development around the world, and she's a Rotary Peace Fellow with her research with her research now centered on strengthening health systems and in particular womens empowerment programs. What an inspirational speaker with a life dedicated to serving humanity.

George Hill is the Chief Operating Officer of Surf Life Saving Queensland whose involvement in that organisation started when he was a nipper when he joined Surf Lifesaving many years ago. What a career : he manages the volunteer lifesaving members, the Westpac Lifesaver Rescue helicopter service as well as state-wide communications. Another inspirational speaker was Holly Ransom she is the CEO of Emergent, and works across corporations, governments and non-profit organisations to provide solutions to complex problems - she coaches and mentors leaders worldwide. She holds a Law degree and was the youngest person to be named in Australia's 100 Most Influential Women. She also holds the distinguished honour of having been the youngest-ever Rotary President of a Rotary Club. Youth participation and engagement are ideals she holds close to her heart when it comes to community service. She was just amazing - dynamic and focussed.

Once again during Conference it was time to look at the bigger picture of Rotary - where Clubs are going and where they have been.
