# **TERRY'S TALE**

We had a very interesting Guest Speaker this last week when we had the pleasure of Sgt Chris Hebblethwaite from the Crime Prevention Unit at Wynnum speak to us about the Qld Police Medal of Merit.

This was the original valour award made to Police in Qld when introduced in the early 1900's. Chris spoke about the circumstances of its creation and the award of the first Medal to Sgt Thomas Heaney of Woolloongabba Station for his actions in locating 2 offenders for a Break and Enter offence at the Norman Hotel in Ipswich Road. Heaney received severe injuries in his efforts to detain the offenders and subsequently died from those injuries some 16 months later. (interesting note here - Because Heaney died more than a year and

a day after the initial offence the 2 offenders were not able to be charged with his murder or manslaughter)

Chris had done a lot of research into Heaney and his role in the event. Chris' investigation and inquiries have resulted in Thomas Heaney's name being added to both the State and National Walls of Remembrance which record the names of Police Officers who have died in the line of duty.

Chris has made an offer to return to our club at some future date to speak on matters of Personal Protection and Home Security. We look forward to seeing him again.

# **VANISHING INTO VANUATU**

Eight of us are off to Vanuatu. This Melanesian nation in the South Pacific Ocean is made up of roughly 80 islands that stretch 1,300 kilometers. The islands offer scuba diving at coral reefs, underwater caverns and wrecks such as the WWII-era troopship SS President Coolidge. Harborside Port Vila, the nation's capital and economic center, is on the island of Efate. And Efate is where we are going!

We will have many things to do and plenty of time to do nothing at all. On Wednesday we meet the Port Vila Rotary club at L'Houstalet Restaurant for a lunch time

meeting followed by an exploration of Port Villa itself. This restaurant is famous for having the same menu for 25 years and is recommended as the best place to try Flying Fox. Reviews for this restaurant range from

fantastic to awful so I hope we arrive on a good day.

On Thursday we will go to Iriki Isalnd which is in Mele Bay, Port Vila. This is great for a day visit and only a short ferry ride on the bay. Apparently the snorkelling is amazing and the cost of the ferry ride is redeemable in food and drink ©



Friday is our big day out. First it is off to Mele school to meet school officials and to

hand over the new building. We will have

our own bus driver, Sam, and he will take us all day and we will be joined by Stephanie Nielsen - the beautiful lady below – from the SHaRM foundation

(sharmfoundation.com for more information). From Mele we travel along the coast to see projects completed by SHaRM, have lunch and travel on to Takara where we should arrive mid-afternoon. After investigating the site and speaking with the Principal and Village Chief we will return to our accommodation at Pacific Lagoon Apartments to refresh.

Then we have dinner at the Mele Beach Bar which features the famous Fire Dancers of Vanuatu.
