A SPECIAL LETTER

Hannah and Margret Wambui are two beautiful girls of ages 5 and 3 years. They hail from Laikipia County in Kenya. They have no any other sibling beside them. They were born by a single mother; Mary Wairimu Kiboi who passed on may 2017. Hannah is in middle kindergarten class and Margret in baby kindergarten class. Hannah likes singing, dancing and acting, whereas, Margaret likes singing and storytelling.

They are orphans who lost their mother out of HIV and AIDS in early 2017. Her mother was a single mother and also an orphan with one sibling, who lived with their old grandmother. Her death incidence was very traumatizing to the little girls. After their mother's demise, they were separated to two different grandmothers. Catherine and Miriam volunteered to take care of them since their great grandmother was not in a good position to take care of them. due to no source of income and she is also old aged.



After a month's time, Margret started developing fevers, colds and wounds on her skin. Immediately she was rushed to hospital and she was found with HIV and AIDS virus. She got it from her mother during birth. She was admitted to hospital and after 2 weeks she was discharged and began taking drugs to control the condition. All this time Cyrus supported both households with food monthly which was a hard task. This did not make a big difference, for instance, Hannah's share was being divided to 12 other children of her grandmother Catherine. Margret was not very lucky too since her grandmother Miriam depended on casual labour and lived in a very small structure which was not conducive for them and her other two daughters. It was also hard to access medical care for her despite the fact that it was frequently needed anytime and feeding all meals was also difficult due to drought in both areas. Poor girls were also separated from each other so it was hard for them to realize the love of being sisters.



Cyrus could hardly have peace knowing that they are suffering like he once did. He requested his aunt Miriam to relocate to his town Naivasha and look after both kids together. This would reduce the cost and children would have good accessibility to good diet and medical care as well as have an opportunity to embrace each other as sisters.

Fortunately, after relocation, a few friends from church joined up and supported them by providing house furniture's and two people among them, volunteered to give them free kindergarten education for 2 years. This was a great boost to us.



'Now they live together and experience sisterly love. It gives me a joy that they are healthy and happy even if I struggle a lot to put food on the table and putting up with rent. On the other hand, I am grateful they are in school. This will run for two years and eventually I will take up the remaining

part of their education. Margret requires a balanced diet, different medication frequently and still I struggle to sustain these situations. I am so willing to take good care of these girls and be a father they never had and mother they don't have any more. As you probably know, I was orphaned when I was little like them. I experienced poverty, a lot of frustrations and hopelessness about life. But fortunately I came along divine destiny connectors; Gordon Lawrence and many Rotarians; all with love and your resources came to my aid and transformed my life, gave me hope and now I am looking towards a brighter future.

Moreover, you all have come to Margret and Hannah's aid by sharing your resources with us. I can now see an assurance of a great destiny and transformed lives for them. For all time in future that you have volunteered to render your support to us we are deeply grateful to you all. We are overwhelmed by your kindness, generosity and most of all great love. You are wonderful people and we love each of you so much. You are all wonderful people, may you live many days in this earth and never lack anything that you will ever need. Good bye wonderful people.
