THE FUTURE OF FOUNDATION:NEW GOALS AND PRIORITIES

The ongoing success of the Rotary Foundation and its life changing ability will be promoted by four new priorities targeted at expanding Rotary's work and enhancing

the image and awareness of the Foundation's achievements.

The four priorities are:
1. Ending polio – now and forever;
2. Strengthening Rotary members' knowledge, engagement, and financial support to the Foundation;
3. Increasing the quality and impact of humanitarian services through Rotary grants and the areas of focus; and
4. Enhancing the image and awareness of the Foundation's record of achievements particularly the success of PolioPlus and its 100-year record of doing good in the world.

These priorities will give a stronger sense of continuity and efficiency to move in a unified direction. These priorities are built in with tangible goals that can be observed annually, at a district level. A crucial goal is deemed to be achieving the 100 percent "Every Rotarian, Every Year" recognition fundraising level by 15 percent in all districts. This goal should be both stimulating and proactive, and is easily notable.

Furthermore, there is emphasis on increasing the number of global grant scholars to at least one for every Rotary district. It was stated that the new scholarships are a perfect opportunity for Rotarians to engage with ambassadorial scholars - where there is a genuine interest in scholars, and as a result, scholars take a genuine interest in Rotary.

The Foundation projects to produce at least two initiatives to identify and promote the need for membership growth in clubs and districts. It is recognised that Rotary cannot continue to provide bigger and more sustainable projects unless clubs grow bigger. In the past, Rotary grew at a rate of 3% a year.

It is now necessary to regain that legacy to be diverse, vibrant, energetic and dynamic, and continue that into the future. As Rotarians, we know that we offer the best chance for prospective members to improve their lives and communities. But we need to communicate this to those outside of our Rotary sphere. We need to use the Rotary network to boost the accumulated time and talent to be the change the world desperately needs.
