LOGGING IN WITH LORRAINE


Greetings fellow Rotarians

Rotary's 6 Areas of Focus.



CENTURION PROGRAM

Have you been thinking about other ways to support the amazing work being done through Rotary? Well, perhaps it's time to consider the Centurion Program, which is a District wide program that acknowledges donations of AUD 100 to The Rotary Foundation (TRF). This can be done in a single payment or through many payments over the course of the Rotary year. In recognition of this, you will receive a Centurion pin on your first year of contributions and a certificate for the following years. Your input will help in the promotion of peace, eradication of polio, disaster recovery, implementation of education, and so much more. TRF is listed as #56 on the Forbes' List of The 100 Largest U.S. Charities for 2017, meaning that there is so much good work that can be done with a revenue of over \$258 Mil. Just think of the possibilities...
