

National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) - ORIENTATION DAY - District 9630

An Orientation Day was held on Saturday 11 October at the UQ Gatton Campus for the successful students in the NYSF program.

Sixteen of the seventeen successful students (one was at a school excursion in France) came along to get to know each other before their coach trip to Canberra next January. Students were asked to invite a member from their Rotary club, a science teacher and their parents. Accompanying our Catherine was her father Nick, her biology teacher Mrs Lauren Downs and myself.

The day went like this:

Following registration everyone was welcomed by the district chairman, Paul Merry. Paul introduced DG Phillip to speak on Rotary's involvement in NYSF.

Lindsey Perry, a PHD student from UQ Gatton, was the guest speaker and spoke about the research she was undertaking (for her thesis) - farming and the environment specifically the effects of methane and its potential for energy harvesting in the cattle regions of northern Australia.

DGE John followed, speaking to the students about their responsibilities to Rotary while in the NYSF program and beyond.

Paul Merry introduced Geoff Burchfield from NYSF Canberra. After a short talk Geoff called on the Staff of the Forum. The 'staff' were students at the previous NYSF who had nominated themselves for leadership training in order to coordinate the next Forum. They each spoke about themselves and then called on this year's students to do the same.

Following lunch, Geoff outlined the activities leading to the final selection of students and what they could expect when they reached Canberra. It was interesting to hear that Rotary clubs along the 22 hour coach route to Canberra try to make the trip a little more enjoyable as they pass through the various towns; for example, arranging time at the local swimming pool or providing cooked breakfast. Canberra Rotarians volunteer to be Aunts and Uncles, making their home available for a visit (mainly so the students could do their washing).

Geoff ended with some interesting achievements of alumni, in particular Sarah Don, who, like Lachlan Oberg, attended MIT Boson. Sarah's interest was nuclear science and she impressed the university staff so much that she was asked to study at MIT on a full scholarship. She accepted and after only a short period was given a licence to manage the university's nuclear reactor even though Sarah was only 17 years old and too young to have a driver's licence.

Our Catherine closed the formal proceedings by thanking the University staff, NYSF staff and Rotarians. She gave a special thank you to the outgoing chairman Paul Merry for his dedication to the NYSF program over the past 14 years. Paul was noticeably honoured by Catherine's words. Students were then taken on a tour of the new science and veterinary facilities of the university.

Four Way Test Have you ever wondered where our Four Way Test

came from or how it began? ---

On having a look at the Rotary Club of Phuket's website in readiness for making them our Club toast last week, this is what I found, so thought I would share it with you.

'One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary Four Way Test. It was created by Rotarian Herbert J Taylor in 1932, when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. The story has it that Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a twenty four word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives.

The Four Way Test became the guide for sales, production, advertising and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy.
