Fellow Rotarians,

On Wednesday night the 12<sup>th</sup> we had a long planned event with the visit of Jeremy Scott who told us of his adventures during an epic bike ride from England back to his home country of New Zealand. It was an inspirational story on perseverance, courage, creativity and survival. Jeremy said his greatest attribute is stubbornness but I think he should add endurance and planning. Faced with a daunting challenge he made the sensible choice and broke it down into a set of minor steps – take it a day at a time - and slowly his skill and hence his confidence grew.

He was also inspired to raise funds for the Heart Foundation and continues to do so in his speaking engagements around Australia.

It was a very enjoyable evening with something for everyone who attended.

The following Wednesday we had a talk from Solar Buddies on a project to provide solar lanterns to children in third world countries that have access to light except through the burning of biomass of fossil

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fuels. The smoke from this a significant and potentially fatal health hazard and it is extremely bad for the environment. The solar lights also have their issues in terms of longevity and disposal. With no controlled waste disposal systems let alone recycling options the failed units, including the Nickle Cadmium batteries will be discarded causing a dangerous and very long term pollution problem. Solar does not necessarily mean environmentally friendly.

I think Solar Buddies need to add a replacement programme whereby, if a failed unit is returned complete then the owner gets a new one for a nominal cost, but if they lose it then they have to purchase a replacement at a much higher cost. There is a lot more work to be done in this area of energy poverty before a true solution is found!

Last Sunday we supported the Diabetes walk in Beth Boyd park, Thorneside. Again our marquees and other equipment were used in the community and we gained great public exposure. Thanks go to Barry, Peter and Matty for seeing this morning through.

This Saturday we ran a Bar-B-Q for Totally Workwear which is promoting their Victoria Point Store. This event comes with a guaranteed donation of \$250 as the actual sausage sizzle is free to all shop visitors.

Also happening in the district is Online training for Rotary Foundation Grant Management (Peter, Steve and myself will do this), Capalaba Club is running a Bookfest in Ormiston on 28<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> October and the Brisbane Kite Festival is on Sunday 23<sup>rd</sup> October from 10.30 at the Murrarie Recreation Ground.
