MAY IS YOUTH SERVICES MONTH

(Formerly called New Generations) when Rotary Clubs, around the world focus on youth services, Rotaract, Interact, RYLA and Youth Exchange.



ROTARACT

Rotaract is a Rotary-sponsored service club for young people ages 18-30. Rotaract clubs are usually community or university-based and are sponsored by a local Rotary Club, making them the "partners in service" and key members of the Rotary family.

INTERACT - stands for International Action

Interact is a Rotary-sponsored service club comprised of 14-18 year olds. Interact gives young people the opportunity to take part in fun, meaningful service projects and develop their leadership skills.

RYLA - Started in Queensland in 1959.

Young people are chosen for their leadership potential to attend a seminar, camp or workshop to discuss leadership skills.

YOUTH EXCHANGE

Rotary Youth Exchange is an excellent and inexpensive way for high school age students to travel and study in a foreign country boarding with Rotary families.
